

Fueling clean energy

Headquartered in Danbury, **FuelCell Energy** is a global leader in manufacturing stationary fuel cell energy platforms for decarbonizing power and producing hydrogen. FuelCell first established a Canadian presence in Alberta in 2012 and has steadily increased its footprint there over the years. Attracted to the region's friendly business environment and deep talent pool, the company is set to launch a \$45 million expansion at its Calgary location to meet growing demand for cutting-edge hydrogen production — helping to fuel a fast-growing North American hydrogen economy.


Canada invests in Connecticut

Trade with Canada supports **92,300 employees in Connecticut** in addition to the **13,700 employees** at
Canadian-owned businesses across the state. In
addition, Connecticut exports \$3.4 billion in goods and
services to Canada.
