

Canada-U.S. defense partnership at TACOM

Canada and the United States work closely at the U.S. Army Tank Automotive and Armament Command (TACOM) in Detroit, Michigan, ensuring the sustainment and management of land-based military equipment for both nations. With \$4-5 billion in shared fleet and equipment, this collaboration enhances military readiness, interoperability, and defense innovation.

Canadian Forces Liaison Officer to TACOM plays a key role in this partnership, facilitating joint investigations, evaluations, and technical issue resolution to keep critical defense assets operational. Canada also works with Michigan's defense industry, sharing expertise and developing joint solutions that support modernization and supply chain resilience.

This collaboration is a prime example of the deep, mutually beneficial defense relationship between Canada and the U.S., ensuring interoperability, innovation, and shared security objectives.

Gordie Howe International Bridge construction continues

Anticipated to be completed in fall 2025, the Gordie Howe International Bridge is the largest infrastructure project on the Canada–U.S. border and will offer a new transportation choice between Detroit and Windsor and create a direct highway-to-highway connection between I-75 and Canada's Highway 401. The impressive new gateway will feature the longest cable-stayed bridge in North America. Ports of entry on each side of the bridge will allow for improved border processing and will be among the largest ports of entry along the Canada–U.S. border.



Canadian partnership drives sustainable biofuel innovation in Michigan


The Michigan Milk Producers Association (MMPA) and Canada-based Dairy Distillery have partnered to transform milk permeate, a dairy byproduct, into low-carbon biofuel, advancing sustainability and economic growth in the U.S. dairy industry.

The \$41 million ethanol plant in Constantine, Michigan, set to open in mid-2025, will convert milk permeate into ethanol for transportation and aviation fuel, reducing carbon emissions by 14,500 tons annually. The project also includes a cutting-edge water treatment facility, powered by biogas from fuel production, reinforcing its near-carbon-neutral design.

This Canada-U.S. collaboration sets a precedent for cross-border sustainability partnerships, creating high-value jobs and strengthening clean energy innovation in Michigan.
