




Li-Cycle strengthens U.S. battery supply chain with Alabama facility

Canadian battery recycling leader **Li-Cycle** has expanded its U.S. footprint with a 100,000-square-foot facility in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, creating 45 new jobs and boosting domestic battery supply chain resilience. With an additional 120,000 square feet of warehousing, the site enhances Li-Cycle's ability to support battery manufacturers and automakers across the Southeastern U.S. as EV production surges.


Using its innovative Spoke and Hub technologies, Li-Cycle is onshoring critical battery material production, reducing reliance on foreign supply chains, and contributing to American energy independence.
