

Canada contributes to Arizona's prosperity

Canada is Arizona's largest foreign direct investor and employer, with 23,900 Arizonans employed by 235 Canadian-owned businesses operating across the state. Among the best-known Canadian companies that have set up shop in Arizona due to its business-friendly climate are consumer goods providers Aldo, Circle K, Popeyes, Cold Stone Creamery, and Iululemon athletica. Canada and Arizona's economies are deeply intertwined through business and investment, totaling \$3.8 billion worth of two-way trade annually.

Canadians and Arizonans know each other well, with over 100,000 Snowbirds having made the Grand Canyon State their short- and long-term place of residence. Canadians are the largest group of foreign homeowners in the state and make up over 95% of all international residents in the Greater Phoenix area alone. Snowbirds and the nearly 1 million Canadians that flock to the warmth of Arizona annually, spend \$2.4 billion each year.




Canadian companies are leaders in key industries, such as aerospace, cleantech, financial services and real estate, that make Arizona one of the fastest growing states. Magellan Aerospace, with operations in Glendale, provides complex assemblies and systems solutions to aircraft and engine manufacturers, and defense and space agencies worldwide. CAE is a worldwide partner of choice in civil and defense aviation and chose Phoenix to establish one of its flight schools to train pilots from key U.S. airlines like American, JetBlue, and Southwest.
