

Canadian suppliers shine in Iowa Grocer's brands

lowa-based grocery retailer, Hy-Vee, is known for its store-brand products - often referred to as "private brands". Hy-Vee offers store-owned brands such as Good Graces gluten-free products, It's Your Churn ice cream, and Paws pet products - all manufactured by external suppliers but sold exclusively as a Hy-Vee brand. As a matter of fact, when it comes to U.S. retailers' private brand sales, Hy-Vee ranks within the Top 10. Products from Canadian suppliers are featured in several of Hy-Vee's private brands, including bakery and snack items as well as beverages. Hy-Vee continues to pursue new Canadian vendors for their private brands due to Canada's innovative, high-quality products and food safety track record.

Des Moines-based **EFCO Forms** designs and manufactures steel concrete forming systems for use in the construction of infrastructure projects like bridges, dams and spillways, parking garages, stadiums, treatment plants, and tunnels. In 1966, EFCO opened its first international location, a sales and manufacturing facility in Georgetown, Ontario. The Ontario facility uses steel milled in both the U.S. and Canada, and ships finished forms to construction sites world-wide.





Connecting communications

Headquartered in lowa City, Marlowe Companies Inc. (MCI) is the parent company for an approximately 2,500 employee-portfolio of tech-enabled business and IT services companies. MCI provides telephone and omnichannel-based customer service, e-commerce, and digital support, inside sales, customer relationship management, and order processing to major customer-focused firms. MCI recently expanded into Canada by acquiring a call center in Sydney, Nova Scotia — renaming it The Sydney Call Centre, Inc — after the previous owner closed the call center and laid off all its workers. MCI benefited from the tenured and experienced call center workforce and was able to reopen quickly, rehiring staff and retaining all the call center's customers throughout North America.
