

Canadian-owned TN Composites expands in Tennessee

TN Composites, a subsidiary of Ontario-based **Limestone Boat Company Limited**, is investing \$23.1 million to expand its White Bluff, Tennessee operations over the next five years, creating up to 132 new jobs and increasing boat production capacity.

By expanding its Jones Creek Road facility, the company will enhance manufacturing efficiency, integrate new technology, and expand research and development capabilities. These improvements are expected to boost production to 14 boats per week, strengthening TN Composites' role in the Aquasport, Limestone, and Boca Bay Boats brands.

"When a company like TN Composites expands in our state, it is not only a testament to the workforce or business climate but also to the community that company calls home," said Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development Commissioner Stuart McWhorter. "We are proud to be the home of TN Composites and thank this company for its continued investment in Tennessee."

Through continued Canadian investment, TN Composites is creating U.S. jobs, advancing boat manufacturing innovation, and reinforcing Tennessee's position in the marine industry.

Expanding U.S. zinc oxide production to meet growing demand

Zochem, a Canadian-founded company and North America's largest manufacturer of zinc oxide powders and pellets, has expanded production at its Dickson, Tennessee facility with a new low-carbon, high-output muffle furnace, adding 15,000 metric tons of capacity.

This expansion supports growing U.S. demand for French process zinc oxide, particularly in battery storage, agriculture, automotive, and specialty chemicals. The state-of-the-art furnace enhances sustainability by maximizing recyclable materials and reducing the facility's carbon footprint.

Zochem's Canadian operation in Brampton, Ontario also supplies 80% of its output to the U.S. and with the Dickson, TN location will supply critical industries, including rubber, tires, chemicals, pharmaceuticals, electronics, coatings, and fertilizers—reinforcing the Canada-U.S. industrial supply chain with high-quality, sustainable materials.




Canada invests in Tennessee

Trade with Canada supports **160,400** employees in Tennessee in addition to the **19,850** employees at Canadian-owned businesses across the state. In addition, Tennessee exports \$9.3 billion in goods and services to Canada.

Canadian-owned companies, including **TNG**, **East Tennessee Natural Gas**, **Decostar Industries** and **Leclerc Foods**, are major contributors to Tennessee's economy. They employ residents in every sector and contribute to the local economy with salary dollars, paying local taxes, and the purchase of goods and services in their supply chain.
