20 FACTS ABOUT THE NORTH AMERICAN ECONOMY

The United States, Mexico and Canada modernized the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) to bring it into the 21st century. The new agreement — the United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA) — builds on NAFTA's successes and continues to support millions of well-paying, middle-class jobs. The USMCA preserves free trade in North America and incorporates new and updated benefits to address trade issues.



North America is the most extensive free trade zone in the world: close to five times the size of the European Union.

Canada and Mexico remain the United States' largest suppliers of agricultural products.



Since 1994, the GDP of North America has increased steadily at an average annual rate of 2.5%.
